The Bachelor of Laws program at the Faculty of Law is based on a comprehensive academic philosophy aimed at producing graduates with a solid legal foundation that combines theoretical grounding, analytical ability, practical competence, and a commitment to professional values. The program is designed with a gradual academic progression that ensures a smooth transition from building general legal concepts to specialization in various branches of law, culminating in preparation for legal practice and scholarly research.

The program is divided into eight consecutive academic levels, beginning with building a general theoretical foundation in the initial levels, then progressing towards deeper specialization in the branches of public, private, criminal, commercial, and international law, culminating in a focus on procedural and applied aspects and legal research in the final levels. This progression aims to enable students to systematically move from understanding basic legal concepts to analyzing legal rules and applying them to practical cases.

The design of the study plan took into account achieving a balance between cognitive, specialized, and skill-based aspects, by distributing the courses across three main dimensions within the program, as follows:

First: The Foundational Knowledge Dimension (approximately 20%)

This includes courses that focus on building the conceptual framework for legal studies, such as general theories of law and the state, the history of law, and some introductory courses that help students understand the nature, sources, and development of legal rules. This dimension aims to establish a knowledge base that enables students to grasp the general structure of the legal system and the philosophy of legislation.

Second: The Structural Specialization Dimension (approximately 65–70%)

This represents the largest portion of the program and includes courses covering various branches of law, such as civil law, administrative law, criminal law, public and private international law, commercial law, labor law, and other legal fields. This dimension aims to deepen the student's specialized knowledge, enabling them to understand legal theories and their practical applications, and to analyze legal relationships across their diverse domains.

Third: The Skills, Professional, and Research Dimension (approximately 10–15%)

This includes courses that develop legal and applied skills, such as pleadings, criminal procedures, professional ethics, scientific research methodology, and graduation projects, in addition to some supporting courses such as languages and computer skills. This dimension focuses on developing skills in legal analysis, legal drafting, and the preparation of memoranda and research papers, thus enabling the student to engage in legal work efficiently and responsibly.

This structure aligns with the standards adopted in designing legal programs within the Bologna Process framework, where specialized courses constitute the largest portion of the curriculum, supported by foundational and skills-based courses that contribute to integrating legal knowledge with practical skills.

6. Credits, Grading and GPA

Credits

AL-Nahrain University is following the Bologna Process with the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) credit system. The total degree program number of ECTS is 240, 30 ECTS per semester. 1 ECTS is equivalent to 25 hrs student workload, including structured and unstructured workload.

Grading

Before the evaluation, the results are divided into two subgroups: pass and fail. Therefore, the results are independent of the students who failed a course. The grading system is defined as follows:
